
She will be missed more than anyone can imagine and has left a huge legacy. I'm sure many of you will have

Charities come to the rescue

When St. Stephen's school had to cancel one of their weekly sessions with us due to largely financial reasons, Brian Richens, long standing volunteer at East Park and general 'Good Egg' sprung into action to save the day.

East Grinstead Lions Club have supported the work of Riding for the Disabled (RDA) based at Little Brook Equestrian, for over 20 years; either as volunteers or with periodic financial assistance.

Brian liaised with, the EG Lions about the situation and orchestrated a linked approach with Caterham, Oxted and Godstone (COG's) Lions to help fund the 1pm afternoon session for a full academic year. Each Club donated £1008.00. Potentially this will help 24 children over the year. The benefits of these sessions are immense and include: helping to improve muscle tone, posture and motor skills, fine and gross. It also helps to develop self-confidence, improve communication, build relationships and learn new skills including valuable life and social skills.
